**Blazon.** On a disc Azure, a shield per fess gyronny of eleven Gules and Or and Azure, a cross couped in fess point of the second, edged Sable; all within a narrow border Red.

Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed “NON NOBIS SOLUM” in Red letters.

Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed “56TH MEDICAL SUPPORT SQ” in Red letters.

**Motto.** Non Nobis Solum.

**Significance.** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red cross symbolizes the medical mission of the unit. The alternating yellow and red denote the excellence and valor of support personnel in providing healthcare. The Latin motto, “NON NOBIS SOLUM,” translates to “NOT ONLY FOR US.”
